## CARING FOR OUR LAKES - WHY A BATHYMETRIC AND SEDIMENT SURVEY IS BEING PERFORMED

Sediment management is something every lake has to have. A lake overtime will fill with sediment causing a change from lake, to wetland and if not cared for; eventually to solid ground. The reason this happens is during rains, sediment is picked up by fast moving water that carries it to the mouth of the lake where it settles out. This occurs because the widening mouth of the lake allows the water flow to slow down, and sediment to then deposit on the bottom of the lake. During rain events water from running through drainage ditches, construction sites, stream banks and agricultural fields all flow downhill towards the lakes. Over time, these sediments accumulate to cause water quality problems as well as reduce lake depth in shallow areas. You can never stop 100% of sediment from entering the lake, but you can develop a plan to help control it.

Right now, at Lake Camelot, there is great concern for the amounts of sediments accumulating creating shallow waters, in turn causing access issues for shoreline homeowners and lake users. For those of you that have been in the coves or live in them, you have witnessed this in our coves already.

Along with accumulative sediments causing poor access for some homeowners, the sediment also causes water quality problems. Nutrients are "attached" to the sediment particles that enter our lakes. These nutrients are the food source for nuisance aquatic plants and algae growth. Last year when our former chemical treatment applicator told me he brought his boss down from Chicago to see the large algae blooms (and the number of them) on our lakes and to take pictures, it was a great wake up call to begin to find ways to come up with a plan we would need to implement as soon as possible.

The Land and Lakes Committee has commendably, with the funds available from within our budget, spent the last two to three years implementing erosion control measures with several projects now near completion. Although we all know erosion control is one of the key elements in keeping sediment from entering our lakes, we also must address the issue of the large amounts of sediment already in the lake with no management plans for removal. The best tool to move forward, practiced by other lake communities and recommended by the professionals, is to have a bathymetric and sediment study done that will tell us how to plan and where we need to start and how to proceed. This affects not only people on the lake but the whole Lake Camelot community.

A bathymetric and sediment study is very important because dredging sediments from a lake is a VERY COSTLY project. Due to the high costs to hire a hydraulic dredging contractor and our low budget for dredging, we began evaluating what options could be available to Lake Camelot that would help us ensure we will be able to remove sediments and achieve water quality improvement. This would as well create a better quality of life and enjoyment for members that use the shallow areas of the lake and the lake in its entirety, hopefully, without having to spend with what could be in excess of a MILLION DOLLARS!

A bathymetric chart is the submerged equivalent of an above water topographic map. These maps are designed to present accurate, measurable descriptions and visual presentation of the submerged terrain. The sedimentation study will show the study of modern sediments such as sand, mud (silt) (in inches) and clay and the processes that result in their deposition. Cost to complete this study is being paid for with current operating funds and coming mostly from monies intended specifically for dredging and erosion control along with lake repairs and maintenance. Cost cutting measures for spraying were newly implemented this year, helping to allow for this study.

At the end of the day, we will have a comprehensive study that will allow the Land & Lakes Committee to proceed with a plan of action over the next several years that will allow our boards to make well informed decisions based on committee recommendations for our plans on having a good lake management program. Our lakes are and continue to be our greatest and most important asset!

**4<sup>th</sup> Place:** "Newski" – John Jotkowski, Sean Newby, Liz Bontz and Haley Gomes



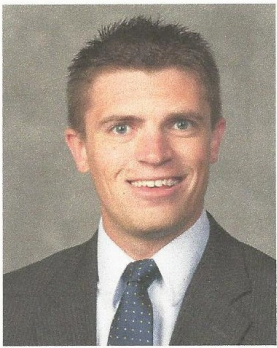

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING  
Wednesday, July 16, 2014  
(unapproved meeting minutes)**

**Call to Order** –President Lynn Johnston called the meeting to order at 6:31 pm. Board Members in attendance were Leah Allison, Steve Harenberg, Gary Smith, William Whitehurst, Cathy Doss & Brian Woertz. Also, Glenda Carlson, General Manager. Steve Schmidt & Matt Buczynski were absent.

**Approval of Minutes** – Cathy Doss asked for minutes from the June 20, 2014 meeting to be corrected as follows: “The General Manager brought to the attention of the board the possibility of hiring a professional company to provide Lake Camelot with a bathymetric and sediment study map. This would allow Land and Lakes Committee to move forward with dredging and erosion control cost projections. Mapping Network which has provided many such studies on lakes in Illinois like ours looked at our lake and provided a cost estimate of \$16,950.00 Steve Harenberg stated this is an important study to enable us to move forward and provide his committee a valuable tool . The General Manager stated funds could be available out of cost saving measures currently be implemented within the land and lakes budget and would look for other company (ies) to also provide a bid. After much discussion, Bill Whitehurst made a motion seconded by Steve Harenberg to approve the bid from Mapping Network but asked the General Manager to first try to obtain comparable bids and the board would wait if a comparable bid was available. Ayes- Cathy Doss, Matt Buczynski, Leah Allison, Bill Whitehurst & Steve Harenberg. Nays- Brian Woertz and Gary Smith. Motion Carried.”

Bill Whitehurst made the motion for the correction to be added and to approve the minutes, seconded by Gary Smith. All in favor- Motion carried.

**Finance Report** – Leah Allison presented the Finance Report. Monthly Income and Expense statement was reviewed for June 2014. Cathy Doss made a motion and Gary Smith seconded to accept the financial report as submitted. Motion carried.

**Covenant Review** – Lynn Johnston reported that the recommendations will be reviewed in-house by Sabrina Petesch before being sent to the attorney’s office. She has indicated Sabrina is in need of additional time for the review but we are still within the timeline previously set forth.

**Security Report** – Brian Emhoff was not present but gave a report to the General Manager, Glenda Carlson. Glenda reported that there were no incidences to report security continues to patrol the lakes, check boat stickers, the RTA grounds and Clubhouse.

A second inspection was performed within the 30 day period. There are still 12 owners needing to correct this issue and will be receiving a phone call reminding them if it is not corrected in 10 days they will receive a \$25.00 fine in accordance with the LC fine structure.

**Lake Spraying/Update:** Greg Dennis and Dennis Woods are working hard on our lakes to keep them free from algae. They are doing a great job!

**Reserve/Replacement Study:** Still In Progress

**Mapping Bids:** Glenda reported that she had checked with the only other company that had been recommended for such a study by other lakes communities or engineering firms,-CloudPoint. CloudPoint did not give us everything within the bid that The Mapping Network is able to provide. The Board has chosen to proceed with The Mapping Network bid. A motion was made by Steve Harenberg, seconded by Cathy Doss. Ayes-5 ,Nays-1/Gary Smith. Motion passed

**New Business**

**Incident/Accident Reports** – There was one incident at the pool and one accident at the lake. The Head lifeguard reported both of these to the office staff and presented it to the Board. The Board would like to thank the guards for addressing these issues in a timely manner and thank them for a job well done.

**Stocking of Lakes-** The Land & Lakes Committee and the Sportsman’s Club will be discussing the stocking of lakes at their August meetings. Fish will be ordered in September.

**Budget Request** – The Board is requesting the Committees to start working on 2015 recommendations by the first of September. The Committees are asked to give their recommendations to Glenda Carlson in the office.

**Telstar - Fiber Optic Installation** - Telstar is replacing the lines in Lake Camelot with new Fiber Optic Lines.

**Bridge Repair on Lancaster Road** - There was discussion and concern about the repair work that will be done on the bridge on Lancaster Road. Lake Camelot residents along with residents from Glasford and Mapleton will be rerouted to avoid the bridge for approximately 1 to 2 years. The Board cannot do anything about this and anyone wanting information should contact Peoria County.

**4th of July Volunteers** - The Board would like to Thank everyone who helped with the July 5th Celebration: Activities Club, Sportsman's Club, Swim Team, Lifeguards, Security, Maintenance and all the volunteers. A huge Thank You to the Fire Department for the help with the Fireworks and all the rides for the kids in the parade.

**Baseball Report:** Leah Allison reported that they had another great season and would like to give a special thanks to Greg Dennis and Dennis Woods for work on the ball diamonds.

Minutes - Land & Lakes Committee

Wednesday, July 2, 2014

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. Committee members in attendance were Collin Cochran, Glen DeLorme, Lynn Gosnell, Deb Metroff, Richard Novitsky and Bruce Welchel; Steve Harenberg, and Steve Schmidt, arrived at 7:30; Glenda Carlson arrived at 8:45. Guests in attendance were Brian Cunningham; Brian Woertz arrived at 7:30.

**Report on the June 18 Board Meeting:** Collin Cochran gave a brief report on the meeting. He also stated that the Board was brought up to date on the status of the Committee's projects that are in progress.

**Erosion Control Project Number 1 (from 2013):** Work remaining on the project includes: 1) cleaning up and grading the site, and 2) final grading and seeding. Weather permitting, the project should be completed in the near future.

**Dam and Bridge Inspection Reports:**

- 1. Dam Inspection Report from Foth - No progress to report.
- 2. Bridge Inspection Report from Foth - No progress to report.

For both the spillway and the bridge, the committee would like the Board's approval before we bring people in to get estimates. The committee wants to be sure that the Board would like the committee to work on these projects; and if they do, would they like the committee to work on short term repairs and/or long term major repairs or replacements.

**Erosion Control and Siltation Projects for 2014**

**Siltation Pond at the West End of Lake Lancelot:**

Work completed includes:

- 1. North bank of silt pond: Constructed machine bench to allow excavator access for dredging. Also, constructed berm for stockpiling dredged material.
- 2. Installed culverts & built access road to the south bank of silt pond.
- 3. South bank of silt pond: Constructed machine bench to allow excavator access for dredging. Also, constructed berm for stockpiling material.
- 4. Dredged siltation pond as far as equipment could reach and stockpiled dredged material behind berms.
- 5. South bank of Lake Lancelot: Cleared trees and vegetation and re-shaped the area cleared.
- 6. South bank of Lake Lancelot: Constructed access road and berm to allow dredging.

Work remaining includes:

- 1. North bank of silt pond: Dredge siltation pond with Long Reach Excavator in area that could not be reached with other excavator.
- 2. Dredge West end of Lake Lancelot with Long Reach Excavator
- 3. Reshape area and haul dredged material (As part of the bid, the contractor has rights to the material)
- 4. Line both sides and top of the new "access road to the south bank of silt pond" with rock.
- 5. Cleanup areas and reseed.

Residents that would like to utilize dredged material will have to wait until the Committee gives the OK for removing the dirt. Dirt will only be allowed to be removed by hand loading, if anyone would like large quantities they need to make arrangements through the contractor.

**Siltation Pond at the North End of Lake Camelot:**

Work completed includes:

- 1. Cleared trees and vegetation.
- 2. Re-shaped the area cleared and constructed berms.
- 3. Dredged the siltation pond and stockpiled material on-site behind berms.

Work remaining includes:

- 1. Reshape area
- 2. Cleanup areas and reseed

**Erosion Control and Siltation for 2014:**

- 1. **Removing Lake Siltation:** Richard Novitsky continues to compile information needed for siltation removal. The Committee discussed different options for measuring current siltation levels in the lakes.
- 2. **Strategy for working with neighboring land owners to control erosion into our lakes:** Prior to this Fall, Deb and Glenda will get together on this project to set up a meeting with the help of Scott Wallace and Gary Gordon from the USDA-NCRS.
- 3. **The park access area that runs between Tewksbury and Canterbury:** Bernie is still working on the park access area and submitted a written report that the committee reviewed. Great Job Bernie.
- 4. **Developing plans for working on additional prioritized erosion problem areas.** Tabled **Budget Planning:** Committee agreed to stay with last year's format that was submitted to the Board.

**Dam Safety & Maintenance Manual that includes our Emergency Action Plan:** Deb will acquire the remaining few names from the residents along Lancaster Road.

**Lake Mapping:** There was some confusion and concern about what was discussed and approved at the last Board meeting. This appears to be a high cost procedure that the committee is not up to speed on. The committee did not take any action on this item.

**Adjournment:** Meeting adjourned at 7:40 pm

Some of the committee members continued to meet after adjournment and discussed lake mapping and retaining a company to do the work.

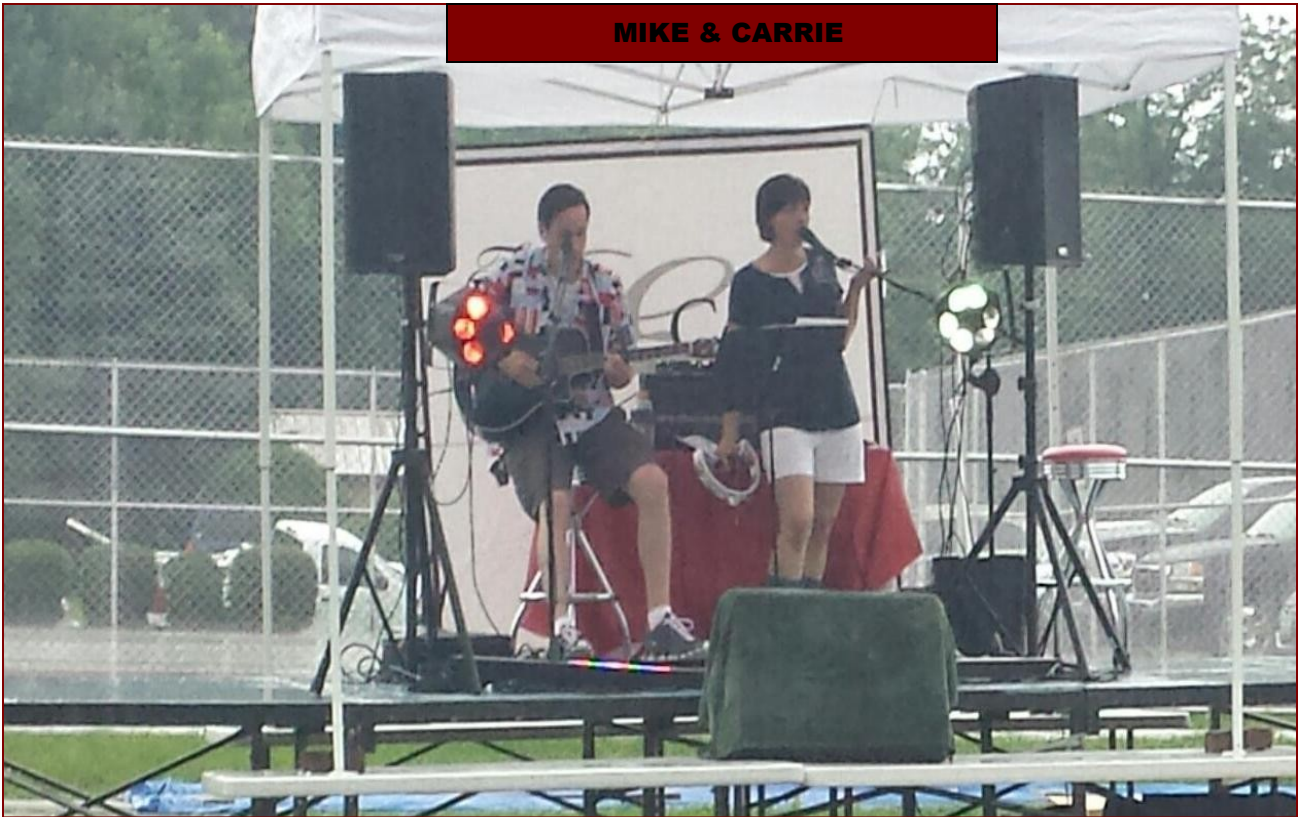
