




CEMETARY WALK





CAMELOT ROUND TABLE ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING MINUTES (UNAPPROVED) April 20, 2016

<u>Pledge of Allegiance -</u> Board Member John Hecker began the evening by asking the group to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Call to Order</u> – President Steve Harenberg called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m. Board Members present were Leah Allison, Tony Baker, John Hecker, Scott Perkins, Bob Wilder, Bill Krokos, Cathy Doss and Bo Pratt. Also present was Glenda Carlson, Acting General Manager.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Bill Krokos made a motion to approve the March minutes with correction of (taking) to talking and (it) to is in the Dredging Committee Report. Tony Baker seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

<u>Finance Report</u> – Treasurer Leah Allison reported the financial statement for March 2016 to the Board and Members present. The Finance Report was approved as presented.

<u>Recognition of Members and Guests</u> – In attendance were: Collin Cochran, Lot 535; Jim Sinclair, Lot 477; Lyndsay Fenwick, Lot 260; Claire Jones, Lot 337; Glen Delorme, Lot 1033; Nick Schwartz, Lot 656; Suzanne Wheeler, Lot 562; John and Jennifer Henderson, Lot 124; Scott Pedigo, Lot 261 and Adam and James Wells, Lot 536.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Infrastructure</u> - Jim Sinclair reported on work done the Bridge, the Weir Dam. He also presented the prices submitted for the ventilation repair needed at the pool house and two quotes that had been received by his Committee. After some discussion, a motion was made by Bill Krokos and seconded by John Hecker to accept the bid from Fritch in the amount of \$1,425.00 to install a fan for better ventilation in the pump room and to get a cost for a steel louvered door for the chemical supply room. All in favor, motion carried. The Fire Hydrant painting project has been started, they have been cleaned and wire brushed. The project is scheduled for completion the weekend of April 23rd. More information regarding the ILRPC is available in the minutes of their last meeting - Page 10.

<u>Land and Lakes</u> – John Hecker reported that Land and Lakes met on April 6th. He informed the Board about their discussion of the work yet to be done by FCI Excavating on Ravine 9 as they are waiting for the county road restrictions to be lifted before the work can commence, the bridge painting and the repairs to the weir dam have been completed and the maintenance department picked up the grass carp from the Illinois Soil and Water Department and placed them in the silt pond and the pond at the water tower per the board's direction. Mr. Hecker has been putting together a manual on Lake Management for the committee members to review and asked anyone with input to please let him know as he will continue working on it in hopes it will be carried on for documentation for future association members in years to come.

Health and Environment – No Report.

<u>Dredging Committee</u> - Bill Krokos reported that there was not a meeting of the Dredging Committee held this month. However, work continues with Joe Rush from Jaedco on the 319 Feasibility Grant. A 319 Grant is a government funding program that may allow us funding towards erosion repairs. Many lake communities who have gone down this path to protect against erosion, develop a detailed lake management plan and dredge their lakes have researched the 319 Grant feasibility for assistance with erosion control. Some fellow lake communities have been successful to receive funds through many years of applying and reapplying for this Grant. We hope to do this as well. The General Manager informed the Board Mr. Rush had contacted the office over the phone and stated that the likelihood we would be eligible for a grant looks promising but has not yet confirmed. We expect to hear from Mr. Rush prior to the next Board meeting.

<u>Security Report</u> – No Report

Activities Club- Lyndsay Fenwick was present and requested the Board allow the inclusion of an outside vendor (shaved ice truck with various flavors) for the 4th of July event. After much discussion, Lyndsay was asked to go back to the vendor and finalize negotiations with them meeting certain requirements to allow them to participate in the upcoming festivities and to report to the office if an agreement can be reached. OLD BUSINESS

Monthly Violation Reports/Update – The General Manager reported violation notices continue to be paid and another property inspection will scheduled within the next week or two. The Board would like to encourage people to follow the rules regarding working light posts, garbage can placement, unlicensed and improperly parked vehicles and others. Working together we can make the community more aesthetically appealing in the summer months when people are out and about and enjoying their surroundings. Please place all waste on RTA property in trash receptacles provided.

<u>Closing of Gate/Lower Lake</u> - The gate on the lower lake has been closed as of this weekend. Both lakes are now closed and the upper lake is up approximately a foot/foot and a half. We are in need of rain to fill the lakes.

<u>Logan Township/FCI Culvert Repair</u> - Logan Township (Kevin Sipp) brought in three/four loads of white rock for other side of road where we completed the work near Lots299/300. We thank Kevin for his participation and working with us to see that this repair was made and completed. <u>Jaedco (Rush) Contract</u> Mr. Rush is scheduled to be here Monday, April 25th for his first visit with our maintenance department and Board Members John Hecker and Bob Wilder. It is Mr. Rush's intent to visit both lakes, evaluate our current weed growth, discuss with Greg and Dennis application techniques and type of chemical applications; to review the type of chemicals we are using and the cost to purchase. Once he has completed his first visit, he will go back and summarize his findings and email his report and evaluation.

<u>4th of July Festivities -</u> Letters are being sent to members on the Lake that could be effected by the Fireworks Display (this waiver for liability is done annually). The application process with the Logan-Trivoli Fire Department will begin within the next few weeks.

<u>Weir Dam & Bridge Painting</u> -The Weir Dam repair has been completed as well as the bridge painting. Photographs of the completed projects have been added to the PowerPoint Slide Show that was available at the Annual Meeting showing the damages to those areas and now the repair.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Fish Fry</u> - The Sportsman's Club 7th Annual Fish Fry is being held May 7, 2016 with dinner from 3:00-7:00 p.m.; music from 8:00 - 11:00 p.m. Adults \$8.00 in Advance/\$10.00 at the door, Kids \$5.00-Anytime. Tickets are available at the Lake Camelot Clubhouse.

<u>Utility Installation Updates-</u> Over the past **several** months utility installation servicers have been making repairs and replacements throughout Lake Camelot. Work is still being done in some areas and restoration is not complete. Spring will allow them to get back out here and begin making restoration to some properties and to continue to make any needed repairs possibly throughout the entire summer. However, if you have concerns or problems you feel are not being addressed, contact the office at 697-5339.

Business Equipment/Office Copier Contract- The Manager presented bids for a new contract for the office copy equipment and recommended the proposal from Watts Service for a multifunctional copier for 60 months and a monthly rental payment of \$56.18 with 6,000 b/w images per quarter. The current contract is for a period of 60 months with a monthly cost of \$62.54 and 3,750 b/w images per quarter. On an average overage costs were being incurred at 1,000+ billable for each quarter. So savings will be incurred due to the reduction in the actual monthly cost of the equipment and the increase in allowable copies. The new copier has the capability of making color copies. The current one does not. This will save on the purchase of replacement ink cartridges on the Office jet Pro used with the Computer. The current contract expires 09/18/16 with ninety days (90) notice to terminate. Tony Baker made a motion, seconded by Bill Krokos to terminate the current contract as of 09/18/16 and enter into a contract agreement with Watts Copy Systems, Inc. immediately thereafter with the equipment rental agreement as presented. All in favor, Motion carried.






