



lower either lake this year based on recommendations from the lake management consultant and other information received,





**Minutes** – Land & Lakes Committee Minutes Wednesday, September 14, 2016

**Call to Order**: Meeting was called to order at 6:30. In attendance were Glenda Carlson, Glen DeLorme, Lynn Gosnell, John Hecker, Deb McBeath, and Scott Perkins.

**Report on the August Board Meeting**: Glenda reported that there had been some concern regarding a possible leak in the lower lake. A search was conducted and there was no leak reported.

#### **Old Business:**

- Ravine #9. Of the three check dams that were constructed, one has failed. The committee questioned the design considering we were following the advice of an expert, in addition to the work being performed by an experienced contractor. F.C.I. submitted an Estimate to double the size of the check dams and restore the site for \$6,978.00. 8"-12" rock will be utilized versus the 4"-6" that was used before. It was also suggested to add "higher on the sides" to the specs. The Estimate will be presented to the Board at the next meeting. The committee agreed that Ravine #9 was to be used as a guide for future sites, therefore we will continue to move forward on the ravine work.
- Ravine #5 needs walked, and John encouraged the committee to do this before the next meeting.
- Shoreline Stabilization Guidelines. Scott passed out a guideline that he has put together. The committee agreed that besides posting the guidelines in our monthly newsletter, we should utilize social media to help get the word out. Residents will need to understand how important it is to ensure that they, in addition to their contractor, know the guidelines. Do not spend money until you have checked with Scott. The Guidelines will be presented to the Board for approval. Dilapidated Docks. Where do we begin?

#### **New Business:**

• IEPA 319 Grant Application. The Association has been pre-qualified. Cathy Molchin has legal expertise in writing grants, and has offered her expertise with the IE-PA 319 Grant. Thank you Cathy!

There was concern expressed in regards to radio controlled boats on the lake.

#### CAMELOT ROUND TABLE ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING MINUTES (UNAPPROVED) September 21, 2016

<u>Pledge of Allegiance</u> - Board Member John Hecker began the evening by asking the group to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Call to Order</u> – President Steve Harenberg called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. Board Members present were Bill Krokos, Leah Allison, Scott Perkins, John Hecker, Bo Pratt and Cathy Doss. Absent was Bob Wilder. Also present was Glenda Carlson, Acting General Mgr.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Bill Krokos made a motion to approve the August minutes. John Hecker seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

<u>Finance Report</u> – Treasurer Leah Allison reported the financial statement for August 2016 to the Board and Members present. The Finance Report was approved as presented. Management noted a clerical error in the finance report printed in last month's newsletter, but stated the report presented at the Board meeting, by the Treasurer, was correct. The amount of funds transferred during the month of July from the CI Account was \$40,000.00.

<u>Recognition of Members and Guests</u> – In attendance were: Kris Jouchim, Lot 116; Kevin and Jill Bleichner, Lot 1001; Ryan Stark, Lot 557; Kelly Gunther-Hecker, Lot 350; Glen DeLorme, Lot 1003; Kristy Bushart, Lot 573; and Angie Robertson, Lot 682.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

<u>Infrastructure/Long Range Planning</u> - No Meeting.

<u>Land and Lakes</u> – John Hecker thanked member Glen DeLorme for the use of his boat used for observation on the upper lake. Discussion was held regarding the check dams on Ravine #9. FCI Excavating had again proposed a cost for additional installation on all three check dams and priced them separately as requested. John stated he, along with any other board members wishing to participate, will be re-checking on two of the three before a decision is made to have all three done by FCI. The Committee is continuing to work on the stabilization plan and the Board was asked to look at the plan as currently presented and have any recommendations or changes by the next meeting. <u>Health and Environment</u> – Discussion was held and Bo Pratt will be looking into the effects of blue algae will report at the next meeting.

Dredging Committee - Bill Krokos reported on the work being done towards possibly obtaining a 319 Grant and thanked Cathy Molchin for her participation, along with also thanking John Hecker for all of his hard work with this Committee. Discussion was held regarding septic maintenance and members knowledge (or lack of) the necessity of placing chlorine tablets in septic systems. John Hecker made a motion, Leah Allison seconded to provide each lot owner with a home in Lake Camelot with one septic tablet and an explanation of the benefits to our lakes when a regular maintenance program is followed. All in Favor, Motion Carried. Bill Krokos presented information on the work and costs he had received regarding the dredging of our lakes. Bill Krokos made a motion to send out a ballot to the membership (to be mailed along with the board election ballots) asking for a special assessment to do the dredging and ravine repair in the amount of \$1,471,000.00, payable over the next five years or all at once. Scott Perkins seconded the motion. All in Favor, Motion Carried. Bill recommended an insert in the newsletter or a post on the official Camelot Page informing the community of all the hard work on the project, the breakdown of costs and payment options that will be made available. Member Angie Robertson suggested an individual flyer placed at people's mailboxes may be more effective. The Board accepted the recommendation and Bill Krokos, along with the General Manager, will put together a flyer to be reviewed by the Board and distributed to the membership. <u>Security Report</u> – Kris Jouchim stated he had nothing to report in the last thirty days and that things have been quiet. Security attended the first dance of the season with no incidence.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

<u>JadEco (Rush) Contract</u> The General Manager reported we have received the equipment purchase recommended by Joe Rush and he will be making a visit with us to view the lakes, instruct maintenance on the use of the equipment and answer any questions we may have.

<u>2016 Board Nomination Chair</u> The General Manager reported Janis Earle has accepted the position of Nominating Chairman for the upcoming board of directors election to be held to fill four positions on the board. Further, members Don Thompson and Chester Burdette will again serve as committee members. Nominations will be accepted through Sunday, Sept 25, 2016 and ballots mailed to the membership by Nov 6, 2016.

<u>The Spot-S. Skolaski</u> The Board approved the schedule submitted for the selling of coffee and/or coffee products outside the clubhouse facility for a period of one year beginning at 6:00 a.m. on Fridays. Use of the restroom facilities will be provided to the vendor during this time period.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

<u>Clubhouse Roof/Hail Damage</u>— The General Manager reported that community member Craig Stafford had brought to her attention that the Lake Camelot Clubhouse roof may have had some hail damage from the March 15th hail storm as he had inspected other roofs in our community and found damage. Upon inspection by Craig and photographs submitted it was determined there was in fact damage to the roof. The Board instructed management to notify the insurance company and obtain three bids for replacement, if approved for replacement.

<u>Lakes- Lake Lowering:</u> After discussion, the Board unanimously agreed that neither lake will be lowered this year.

Annual Fish Purchase/Delivery 2016— The General Manager informed the Board with the previous alternation of catfish and walleye in previous years, that walleye would be the recommendation this year. The Board asked Scott Perkins to check with the Sportsman's Club and ask if they will continue to participate in this purchase at a cost not to exceed \$1,000. Further instructed the General Manager to obtain costs for the purchase of 400 walleye 6"-8", any delivery charges and the anticipated date of delivery.

<u>Peoria County/Early Election Voting/Clubhouse</u>— The General Manager reported she had received notification that early voting will take place at the Lake Camelot Club house on Thursday, October 27, 2016 from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

#### **Letter from the Board**

Fellow Lake Camelot Members,

This letter is to inform you that at the recently held board meeting on September 21, 2016 the board was given preliminary budget numbers for the Dredging Project and Ravine Repairs. The Ad-hoc Dredging Committee, with 13 members, was formed in the middle of last year and has been working diligently to prepare the most effective and least cost way for this proposed project. The last time the lakes were dredged was about 24 years ago and without erosion protection established. Because of the lack of erosion protection in the ravines, the earth and debris have been entering the lakes and filling them up. A Hydrographic and Sediment Survey was done in August 2014 to determine the troubled silted areas in the lakes. Last year, a Ravine Study was performed in January 2016 to highlight troubled ravine areas. In addition, this year we have done some lake management training and testing.

The board has realized that this is large community problem and if not addressed will deteriorate our lakes and ravines further. Fish population and quality will eventually decrease and the silted areas will become even shallower, consequently, unusable by the community. Your property value may become stagnant and even decrease in value. As your board, we have an obligation to the community to address these problems to protect Lake Camelot.

The Dredge Committee has done a lot of research to learn best practices from other lake communities and experts in the field. It was decided to not to reinvent but to duplicate the best practices and incorporate them for our community. This was done with well over 1000 hours by volunteers. Currently, we are starting on a 319 Grant to application process with volunteers and if awarded would assist with money towards the ravine repairs. We will keep you posted.

Other committees have been involved like the Land and Lakes and have started with budgeted funds on the first trial ravine repair. This trail repair will help us determine the magnitude of work, the cost to be performed in the future ravines and assist us with the 319 Grant application process planning.

By utilizing current Lake Camelot properties as dewatering sites we are able to save \$\$ on property and additional engineering costs. (The board received a preliminary budget analysis supplied by leader in the Dredging field. The summary of the analysis is listed below.) Preliminary cost of the project is expected at \$1.22 Million Dollars. The cost of the ravine repair estimates (Approximately \$250,000) will need to be added to this for a complete cost for the project. Utilizing our current properties will save the community lots of money and these properties will be brought back to close to original form (just a little taller). This work is included in the cost. (See Below)

Therefore, the estimated cost of the total project is \$1,471,000 (\$1,221,000 for dredging plus \$250,000 for ravine repairs). What does that mean for each owner? We have 698 lots. Two (2) options will be made available to make either a full pay upfront or allow a lot owner to split the cost over a period of five (5) consecutive years. This will be in addition to your due (s) currently paid yearly.

\$1,471,000/698 lot owners = \$2,107.45 per each lot owner (Paying a onetime fee)

\$2107.45 / 5 years = \$421.49 per each lot owner (Paid yearly for 5 years) =\$35.12 per month

It is a chunk of money either way you look at it. To be put into perspective, say we use an estimated value of each lot owner home at \$200,000 and we understand there are 698 homes. And, Lake Camelot's properties value at \$10,000,000. The total cost of the project is low percentage of total property value.

\$200,000 x 698 = \$139,600,000 Combined Home Owner Property Values + \$10,000,000 Lake Camelot Estimated Property Value = \$149,600,000

If we divide that by the preliminary cost of the project it is only 1% of total property value. So if you had to replace a hot water heater in your home it would feel like that as a whole.

\$149,600,000/1,471,000 = .01% or 1% of Total Property Value

Finally, with the help from Land and Lakes committee, the board will develop a comprehensive lake management plan for all future boards and management to follow. What do we need to do next? The board will be inserting a voting ballot in the up and coming board members election ballots. We ask for your vote for the project.
