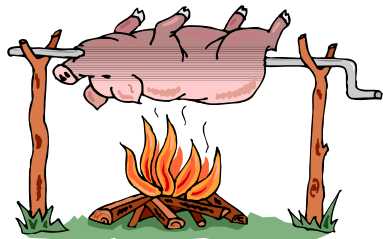

IBES principal:

Here's Janet's courageous story. My family moved to Peoria in June, 2010 when I took the job as principal of Illini Bluffs Elementary School. My husband, Jon found a job as a teacher in the area and my sons, Noah and Eli started 3rd grade and Kindergarten at IBES. We spent our 1st year here building a house in Lake Camelot and moved in on Easter weekend in April 2011. I immediately fell in love with the students and staff at IBES and have been so proud to be a part of the community. In September 2014, I went to the doctor for my annual female checkup and my doctor found a tumor on one of my ovaries. I was immediately referred to an oncologist who did further testing and I was diagnosed with stage 3 ovarian cancer because the cancer had also spread to my abdomen and appendix. I had surgery to remove all the visible cancer and immediately began 8 rounds of aggressive chemo every three weeks. I continued to work during my chemo treatments and found my encouragement to keep fighting through the side effects from my family and the staff, parents and students of IBES. At the end of the aggressive treatments my cancer counts were drastically improved and it was decided that I would continue chemo treatments once a month for another year. I had my last chemo treatment in March, 2016. Due to my family history of cancer, my doctor recommended I go through genetic testing, which found I was positive for the BRCA 2 gene giving me a 90% chance of having breast and/or ovarian cancer by the time I was 55. Since I was 47 and already diagnosed with ovarian cancer, I decided to have a preventative mastectomy in June, 2016. Today, I am happy to be beginning my 7th year as principal at IBES, my husband continues to teach in District 150 at Harrison School and my sons will be in 9th grade and 6th grade in the IB school district. It has been a long, but blessed journey and after 2 years, 2 major surgeries and 20 chemo treatments I am currently in remission and cancer free.

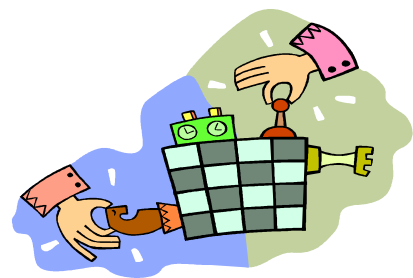

good standing.**

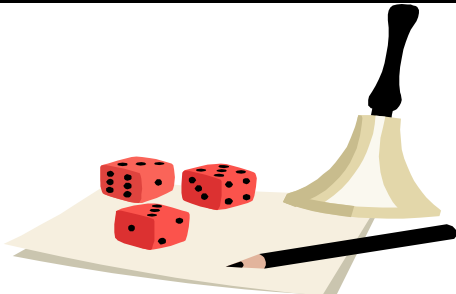

Minutes – Infrastructure/Long-Range Planning Committee (ILRPC)
Tuesday, August 9, 2016

Call to Order - The meeting was called to order at 5:00 PM. Committee members in attendance were Suzanne Wheeler, Darrel Hedman, and Kevin Arduini. Committee member absent – Jim Sinclair.

Report on the July 2016 RTA Meetings – Kevin reported that the Board agreed that at least three bids be obtained for both the flat roof as well as the pitched roof option and present the committee’s proposal at the August Board meeting. In addition, the Board asked the committee to look into expanding the pool house pump room ventilation fan.

Swimming Pool Complex –

Kevin Arduini presented an update on the progress with securing the necessary estimates for repairing or replacing the pool house roof. An updated estimate was received from Svendsen Construction verifying their earlier estimate of \$14,677.00 for a pitch roof. Two more estimates are expected by the end of the week from Copelen Construction and Tim Muccianti Builder.

Update 8/11: Copelen construction submitted an estimate for \$20,963.82 for a pitch roof.
Muccianti Builders indicated that they would they would provide a estimate by Tuesday Aug 16.

BOARD MEETING MINUTES (UNAPPROVED)
August 17, 2016

Pledge of Allegiance - Board Member John Hecker began the evening by asking the group to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Call to Order – President Steve Harenberg called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. Board Members present were Bill Krokos, Leah Allison, Scott Perkins, Bob Wilder, John Hecker, and Cathy Doss. Board Member Bo Pratt was absent. Also present was Glenda Carlson, Acting General Manager.

Approval of Minutes – John Hecker made a motion to approve the July minutes. Leah Allison seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Finance Report – Treasurer Leah Allison reported the financial statement for July 2016 to the Board and Members present. The Finance Report was approved as presented.

Recognition of Members and Guests – In attendance were: Mike Stender, Lot 78; Jim Sinclair, Lot 477; Dave Sule, Lot 428; Ann Miller, Lot 886; Lynsday Fenwick, Lot 266; Mike Johnston, Lot 498; Dave Johnston, Lot 479; Claire and Garrett Jones, Lot 337; Glen DeLorme, Lot 1033; Dennis Woods, Lot 773; Ryan and Allison Millinger, Lot 486; Adam Gillies, Lot 461; Dimitri Almasi, Lot 667 and Jodi Nutter, Lot 474.

General discussion was held regarding the upper lake not yet being at full pool. The Board indicated additional measures would be taken to address the situation if the lake does not achieve full pool with the upcoming projected rains. Attempts to view any areas of possible leakage have been completed by maintenance and members of the board.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Infrastructure/Long Range Planning - Jim Sinclair reported that the committee had met on August 9th and discussed the bids received on a new roof for the pool house. Please read Committee Meeting Minutes on Page 5 of the September newsletter for more information.

Land and Lakes – John Hecker reported on his meeting with Bill Shafer from Illinois Valley Surveying on Ravine #9 regarding check dam installations by FCI Excavating and also on recommendations needed for written specifications to go forward. Land and Lakes will continue to work with management on specifications for additional installation on check dams currently installed and contact FCI for an affirmation of cost. Mr. Hecker noted that the cost may increase with the need for larger rock. This will be clarified with the Board prior to the work commencing. He also touched on shoreline stabilization and standardization. His Committee continues to work on this project. Mr. Hecker recommened all lot owners be asked to identify their lots from the shoreline for easier identification.

Health and Environment – No Report.

Dredging Committee - Bill Krokos reported on the summary of the findings of the 316 Grant Feasibility Study received from Joe Rush/JadEco, Inc. He informed us we are eligible to be considered for the Illinois EPA 319 (h) Clean Water Act funding. Please see a printed copy of the summary in the September 2016 Newsletter, Page 7,

Security Report – No Report.

CLUB REPORTS

Activities Club- Cathy Doss reported there was discussion about purchasing a slide for the pool. Further discussion was held about the dances being cut back to one every three months, the fall garage sale being held the third Saturday in September and the October Halloween pumpkin carving and costume parade for the children. The Club reported a profit of \$500 from the fourth of July festivities.

Sportsman’s Club – The report was given by Bob Wilder. Replacement of several boards on the upper boat ramp dock was performed by members of the Sportsman’s Club a few weeks ago, they are planning a trip to a Chiefs game in September and will be participating in the 8th Annual Pig Roast in honor of Dave Alwood, being held on September 17th.

Leah Allison made a motion to accept all ECC recommendations that had been approval including, after some discussion with Mr. Almasi, the installation of a boat lift for Lot 667, Bill Krokos seconded. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Monthly Violation Reports/Update – The General Manager continues to update the violation reports and any fines issued to the Board. A list is published in the Lake Camelot News monthly.

Water Tower Pond Spraying— Marine Biochemists treated the water tower pond for duck weed for a cost of \$680.00. Discussion had previously been held regarding the possibility of filling this pond in. IL American Water contacted the Lake Camelot office and expressed the importance of having that pond remain for water tower overflow and semi-annual water tower cleaning.

FCI Excavating/Ravine #9—John Hecker volunteered to review the bid from FCI Excavating for the adjustment of specifications needed for additional installations on the check dams at Ravine #9. He expressed to the board the increase in the size of rock and other requirements may increase the cost of the initial bid. Prior to beginning the work, the revised work order and bid costs will be submitted to the Board for review.

JadEco (Rush) Contract - The General Manager reviewed a letter received from Joe Rush recommending the purchase of a Multi Parameter Meter and/or a 15Meter Cable/Probe to be used for temperature and dissolved water testing. Samples of the lakes are being taken every two weeks and Dennis Woods will gather the information and complete the required forms to be sent for us to participate in the Volunteer Lake Monitoring Program. Bob Wilder made a motion, seconded by Leah Allison to purchase the testing equipment recommended by Joe Rusk in lieu of services within the contract for lake management reporting/consulting not to exceed a price of \$2,000. All in favor, motion carried.

4th of July /Association Report– The General Manager provided a line item report of expenses for the 4th of July within the association activities budget for the board to review.

Pool Regulations/Age Admittance to the Pool - After some discussion and no reports of incidence, Scott Perkins made a motion to keep the age requirements for admittance to the pool from 16 to 13 to allow them to watch children over the age of 7 years. Children under 7 years of age must be with a person 16 years or older and children 12 years of age are allowed to enter the pool by themselves. Bob Wilder seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Request for Use of Clubhouse Facility/Girl Scouts—Member Jodi Nutter requested the use of the Clubhouse facility on two Thursdays throughout the school year; one for a daisy troop and the other for a girl scout troop. The board authorized the use of the facility with the understanding if a rental becomes available, said meeting will be held in the lower level, tables & chairs will be wiped down and put away and floors will be swept of any debris.

Fall Garage Sale/8th Annual Alwood Pig Roast—Both events are being held on Saturday, September 17th. Tickets to the Pig Roast will be available at the Lake Camelot office or from a member of the Alwood/Edwards family.

Nominating Chairman/Committee for 2016 Board Election— The Board instructed the General Manager to get with last year’s committee chair person for recommendations on a new committee chairperson from the committee or to assist in finding someone interested in being appointed to the chair.

Executive Session– Scott Perkins made a motion to go into executive session at 8:20 p.m., seconded by Bill Krokos. Motion carried. Bob Wilder made a motion to come out of executive session at 9:10 p.m., seconded by Bill Krokos. All in favor, motion carried.

Action Resulting After Executive Session– 2017 Budget meetings to start Tuesday, September 6, 2016 at 6:30 p.m. every Tuesday through October 18th. The first half hour of every meeting will be open to the membership to ask questions, present ideas or make recommendations. John Hecker made a motion to require all lots on the lake to have lot numbers placed on them visible from the lake by 2017. Bob Wilder seconded, motion carried. The Land and Lakes Committee will gather information to provide to the membership on the type of application to be used for identification; once approved by the Board it will be specified. Bill Krokos made a motion, seconded by Bob Wilder to have Steve Harenberg check into costs of SKS for cameras to be used for scoping a possible pool leak and upper dam lake area. All in favor., Motion carried.

Adjournment – Motion was made by Leah Allison to adjourn at 9:20 p.m., seconded by Bob Wilder. All in favor, motion carried.

**INFORMATION RECEIVED REGARDING FEASABILITY REVIEW SUMMARY
FOR ILLINOIS EPA 319 (h) CLEAN WATER ACT FUNDING 2016**

There is stiff competition for these grants, and as previously stated, approximately \$3.5 to \$4.5 million in funds are awarded in Illinois annually. Application requests are generally upwards of \$10 million, annually. Therefore, there are no guarantees of funding with these programs, and they are directly related to legislated budgets as well as requests and review of those requests. However, if awarded the funding can be up to 60% of the total project cost.

The Camelot RTA resides in a watershed that drains into the 303(d) listed West Branch of LaMarsh Creek. Camelot RTA is also in the western edge of the larger Middle Mississippi River Watershed (MMRW). The MMRW was studied for a TMDL and final reporting was provided in 2012. Both of these may give higher priority ratings for any grant applications you submit for 319(h) funding.

The Camelot RTA watershed falls under the 2018 priority basins for Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Section 319(h) Grant Program planning funding, and the 2020 priority basins for 2020 implementation funding. Therefore, any grant applications for 2018 planning should be submitted no later than August 1, 2017. Historically, these dates have been consistent, but you should monitor IEPA announcements about application requests. Applying in a priority year is the best opportunity for funding a project, but you can apply at other times as well.
