NOTICE

Many have reported a recent fish die-off involving small crappies on the Upper lake. After inspecting the fish found dead, the die-off appears to be a fungus on the fish's lips and gills, making it hard for them to filter oxygen from the water. The recent lake treatment to reduce the amount of algae has come into question as a possible reason for the die-off. With that being said:

While treating the lakes with chemical herbicide does tend to reduce the amount of dissolved oxygen in the water as the vegetation dies off, had there been an over-treatment as some have suggested, there would have been other species of fish effected.

In my many years of fish management, I have experienced similar die-offs of crappies, each time attributed to overpopulation of the species. In each instance, including the event occurring here on Lake Camelot, no other species of fish were affected. This is simply Mother Nature's way of balancing out a fish population, and we should not become over-alarmed. The next few years should see fast growth for the large number of crappies that still remain, quickly resulting in an exponential size increase for those crappies you'll soon be catching.
